- AOM's desire is to establish churches devoted to holiness, obedience to Christ, small group accountability, and a vision to evangelize their people and beyond.

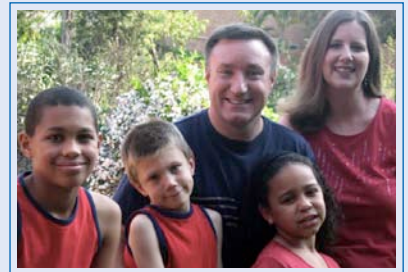

- **SPIRITUAL HARVEST:**

1 AOM HAS TWO MAJOR FOCUSES:

CHURCH PLANTING

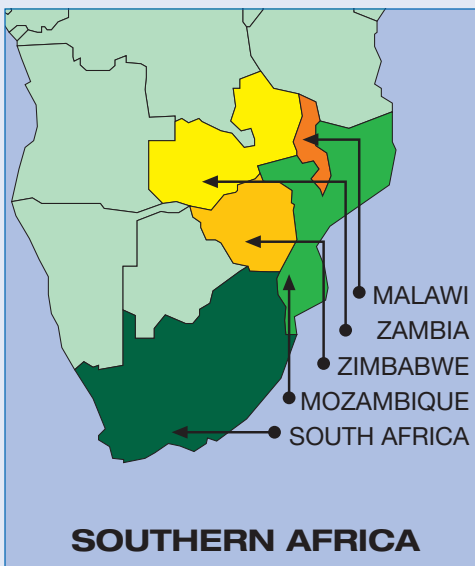
- AOM is assisting related churches in Zambia, Zimbabwe and Malawi to continue planting new churches. Through coaching their leaders, over 50 churches are being encouraged to plant daughter churches. Nine new churches were planted last year.
- AOM is starting a new fellowship of churches among the unreached Tonga and Tswa peoples in Mozambique. This ministry was begun in mid-2007.

LEADERSHIP TRAINING

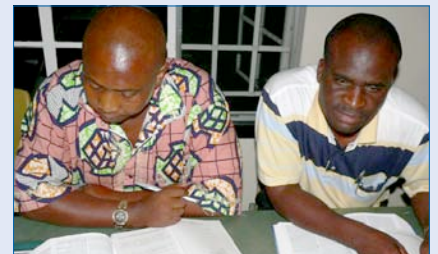
- AOM has moved to a new paradigm for its leadership training, i.e. training only key leaders in Zimbabwe and Zambia. These men assign goals for themselves as to how they will train the various church leaders under them. All materials are taught in a reproducible format. The key is re-teachable lessons that cascade throughout the churches.
- In South Africa, AOM has launched a program of training qualified pastors from Bible believing churches to teach an extension seminary course called BTCL (Bible Training Center for Leaders). The vision is to see training centers established in all the provinces of South Africa presently without the BTCL program.

MOZAMBIQUE - AOM'S NEW MISSION FIELD

Gustavo and Beatriz Fuentes moved to Inhambane in May 2007 to begin laying the foundation for a Church Planting Movement among the Tonga and Tswa peoples in this province of Mozambique. Less than 1% of the Tonga and Tswa attend an evangelical church. The vision is to start hundreds of house churches in the Inhambane province that will spread over the nation of Mozambique. The Harris family will join the Fuentes to form the field team.

2 AIDS ORPHAN ASSISTANCE

The pandemic of AIDS in Africa has produced millions of orphans. Historically, the African culture has relied upon extended family members to care for orphaned children. In Zimbabwe, AOM assists 160 orphans with school fees and uniforms, supplemental feeding, obtaining medical care, providing spiritual support through pastoral care, camps and a weekly Bible club and pastoral care. In Zambia, 110 orphans are assisted through the Followers of Christ Fellowship. All the orphans are living in their extended families.
